The Innocents Society only considers applications from UNL students who: (i) have maintained a minimum 3.3 G.P.A., (ii) have completed no fewer than four and no more than six academic semesters excluding Spring 2026, (iii) have completed at least 89 total credit hours by August 2026, and (iv) plan to graduate no sooner than Spring 2027. #### I. Academic Résumé:

Please include an academic résumé no longer than one page. List and briefly explain your academic involvement, membership in honorary organizations, and honors and awards in reverse chronological order. Please also provide your cumulative G.P.A., major(s), and minor(s). **Do not include your name on this page**.

#### II. Extracurricular Résumé:

Please include an extracurricular résumé no longer than one page. List and briefly explain your extracurricular involvement, service activities, and work experiences in reverse chronological order. **Do not include your name on this page.** 

# **III. Essay Questions:**

Please answer the following questions, each one on its own sheet of paper. Each response must be typed and double-spaced with one-inch margins, 12-point Times New Roman font, and numbered appropriately. Unless otherwise noted, your responses should be no longer than one page. **Do not include your name on these pages.** 

- 1. Discuss a pivotal experience that transformed your perspective on learning and strengthened your commitment to your academic journey.
- 2. Describe how your leadership has helped build an inclusive community, respecting the contributions of the past while opening new doors for those to come.
- 3. Consider the impact of selfless service on building and maintaining strong communities. Share an example of how you have positively influenced the University or your community through selfless service.
- 4. Imagine that you have just finished writing a 1500-page autobiography. Reproduce page 1313.
- 5. Write your own essay prompt and answer it in 300 words or less.

#### V. Submission Guidelines:

Please submit your application according to the following guidelines:

- 1. All applications should be submitted by email to <a href="mailto:131">131</a> nm on January 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2026. Please send your application in a single email with the subject: Last Name, First Name Innocents Application. Submit each of your essay responses, academic resume, extracurricular resume, personal information form, and class schedule (found on the Innocents Society website) as a separate PDF attachment in this email. The file names should be Personal Information, Academic Résumé, Extracurricular Résumé, Class Schedule, Essay 1, Essay 2, Essay 3, Essay 4, and Essay 5. Your essays and resumes should not contain your name, as we would like our selection process to be fair and anonymous.
- 2. Your letter of recommendation should be submitted in the form of a separate email from your recommender and sent to <a href="mailto:13innocentssociety@gmail.com">13innocentssociety@gmail.com</a>. This email should also be received no later than 1:13 pm on January 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2026. The subject should be in the following format: Your Last Name, Your First Name, Letter of Recommendation. The document should be a PDF with the file name: Letter of Recommendation.
- 3. Include your name only in the files that specifically request your name and/or signature. Do not include your name on any other pages.
- 4. If you are applying to multiple honor societies, please send the preference form to <a href="mailto:studentlife@unl.edu">studentlife@unl.edu</a> with the subject being: Preference Form. **DO NOT** send this file to the Innocents email as your preference is confidential.
